Pricing and Logistics

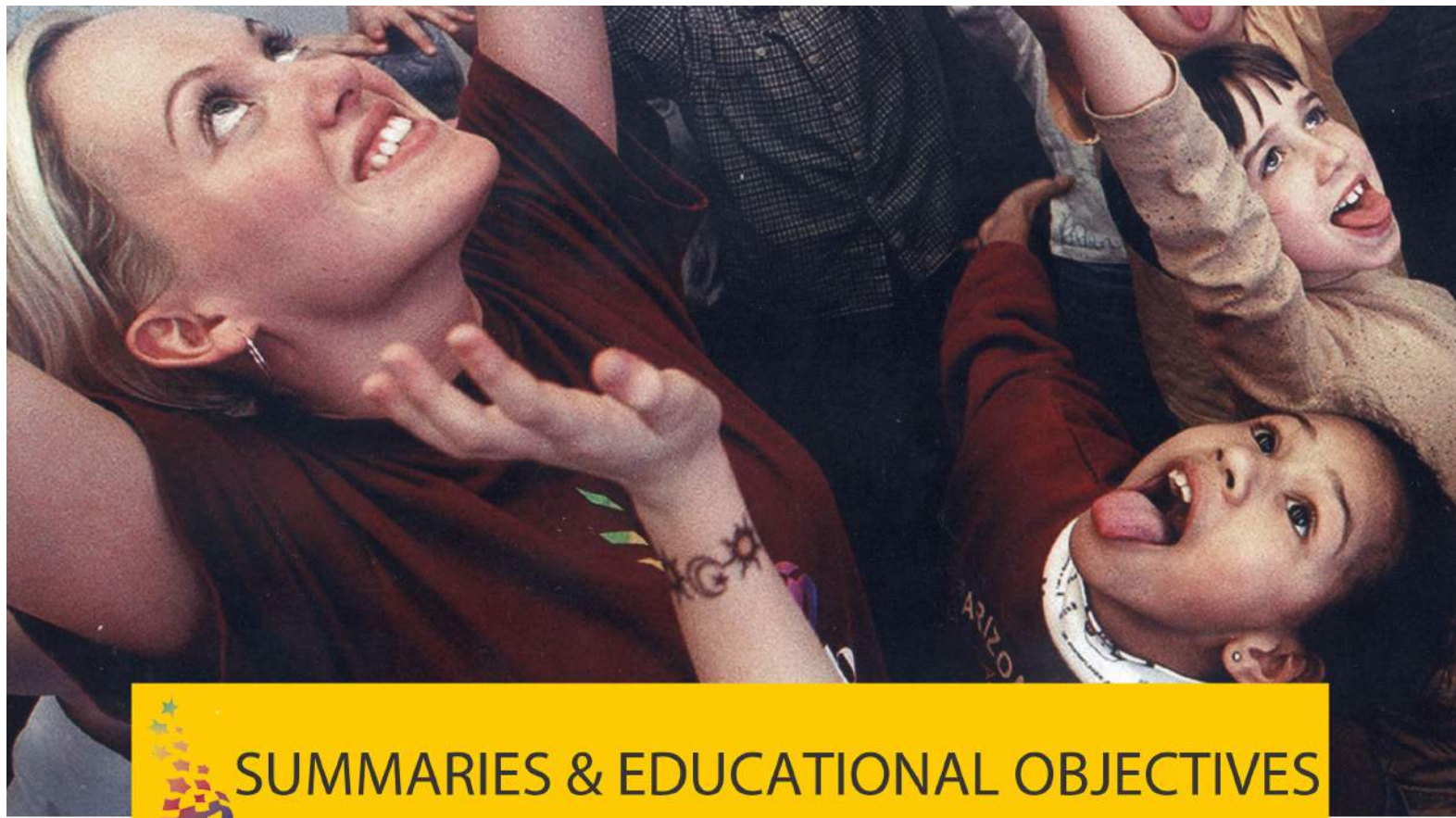

SUMMARIES & EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

The Floamian Manuflack (K-2)

Summary

In this enthralling class, your students help storytellers Ajax Applesauce and Spartacus Stroganoff learn how to stay safe while standing up to bullying and how to help when they see others being bullied.

Educational Objectives

- To provide a definition of bullying behavior through demonstration.
- To encourage students to think critically about how assertiveness and passivity are communicated through body language and tone-of-voice.
- To provide students with an assertive verbal response to bullying behavior.
- To discuss and practice appropriate bystander behavior.

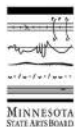
SEW Bullying: Making Schools Safe for Everyone (3-6)

Summary

In this class, we use games, role-playing, scenes, and discussions to help kids stand up to bullying in their own way. Our SEW steps (Say stop, Engage in something else, Walk away) help students feel more comfortable and confident responding to bullying.

Educational Objectives

- To define bullying.
- To explain the difference between bullying behavior and other instances of meanness or conflict.
- To identify various types of bullying.
- To present and demonstrate steps for responding to bullying situations.
- To encourage students to be kind to people who are bullied.
