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OBJECTIVES AND LOGISTICS

Educational Objectives

- To explain and demonstrate the concept of waste Reuse (creatively reusing items you may have thrown out, holding yard sales, bringing things to Good Will).
- To explain and demonstrate waste reduction (Replacing paper products with more permanent ones, buying bigger amounts of things, purchasing items with less packaging).
- To show items that are recyclable and explain what happens when things are recycled.
- To explain landfills.
- To give reasons why the 3 R's should be practiced.

Pricing & Logistics

The performance is about 40 minutes long. We can see up to 350 students per performance. The space should be at least 10' tall, 16' wide, and 20' deep. CLIMB provides all technical requirements, including sound, set, and costumes.

Pricing is \$660 per performance, plus travel.
