Innovative Techniques


Using scenes, meaningful discussions, and games and activities, CLIMB's classes help students make new discoveries, practice social skills, and achieve learning objectives.



Pricing and Logistics

Actors move classroom-to-classroom and can see up to 7 sections of 35 students per day. Each class is 40 minutes long. Pricing for classes is \$639 per day, plus travel.

Blame on the Range (K-2)

Summary

When Leftboot Larue shows up late for the weekly meeting of the Peace Rangers, it's clear that he's been afflicted with a surefire case of the Blames. As students play the part of the Peace Rangers, they will define their own personal responsibilities, learn how to avoid blaming others, and help Leftboot learn how to take responsibility for his actions.

Educational Objectives

- To define responsibility.
- To brainstorm situations in which responsibility should be demonstrated.
- To identify the feelings that keep people from being responsible.
- To show the consequences of failing to show responsibility.
- To show how to make responsible choices.


Mess Up, Fess Up (3-6)

Summary

Being a kid isn't easy. Friendships, schoolwork, and an ever-expanding list of extracurricular activities cause kids to take on a lot of responsibilities. This class gives each student the opportunity to brainstorm their responsibilities at school and home, play an activity to demonstrate what it means to be responsible, and role-play a common scenario involving personal responsibility.

Educational Objectives

- To define responsibility.
- To brainstorm common responsibilities students their age might have.
- To explore the consequences of ignoring responsibilities.
- To present strategies to help students take responsibility for their actions.
- To suggest ways students can develop more responsible habits.
